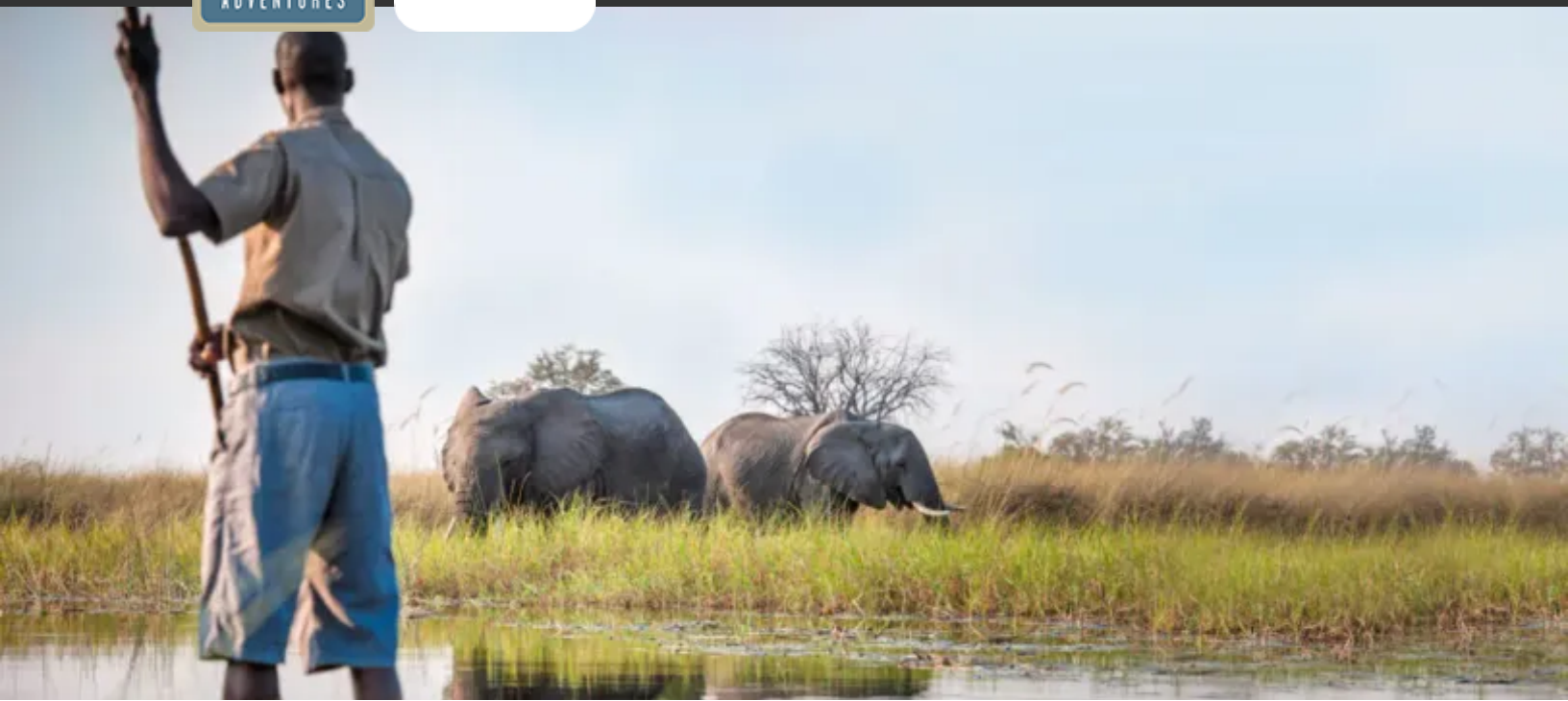

This immersion in the Botswana bush reveals the essence of wilderness, protected by a conservation-minded country that leads the continent in habitat stewardship. An ancient landscape occupied by the San people for more than 100,000 years, Botswana today is a stronghold for elephants, home to Africa's largest population of 130,000, as well as endangered species such as lion and wild dog. Sprawling savannas, mopane woodlands and the vast Okavango Delta sustain a multitude of wildlife that thrives within this mosaic of ecological diversity. From our traditional canvas camps that are exceptionally comfortable without extravagance, explore widely varied habitats on game drives, bush walks and dugout canoe excursions. And when night falls, gather around the campfire to revel in each day's wonders, as the stars glitter overhead and animal calls resound in the darkness.

MAUN / MAKGADIKGADI PANS NATIONAL PARK

Day 1: Watch elephants from a floating hide on the Boteti River

- View elephants and other wildlife at close range from a floating hide
- Stay at a classic tented camp overlooking the Boteti River on the edge of the Kalahari Desert
- Look for crocodiles, oryx, springbok, lions, cheetahs and other wildlife drawn to the river

On arrival in Maun, our Expedition Leader meets you at the airport before our overland transfer to the western edge of Makgadikgadi Pans National Park. Our classic tented safari camp overlooks the Boteti River in the Kalahari Desert—360,000 square miles of sandy, semi-arid savanna that sustains a proliferation of wildlife. Following afternoon tea, watch wildlife from a floating hide where we often view scores of elephants at close range. The river is a lifeline flowing through these parched environs, and it attracts Africa's second-largest zebra and wildebeest migration. It's common to see lounging crocodiles—our camp's namesake. And we frequently see other animals stopping for a drink in front of camp, too, including oryx, springbok, Kalahari lion, cheetah, hyena, jackal and ostrich.



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KALAHARI DESERT

Day 2: Discover Kalahari wildlife and San traditions

- Search for zebras, giraffes, gemsbok and springbok on a 4x4 wildlife drive
- Walk with San guides who share traditional knowledge of plants, animals and the desert
- Dine beneath star-filled skies around the campfire

Explore the western sector of the national park by 4x4, where a multitude of game ranges across a landscape of scrub, palms, riverine trees and grassy plains. Within the Kalahari Desert, the immense reach of Makgadikgadi is traversed by zebra, giraffe, springbok, gemsbok, wildebeest and more. The animals make their way across the desolate expanse in search of water, arriving into the park's remote western reaches to congregate by the river. We also explore on foot with local San people, who reveal as much about their Indigenous culture as the native plants and wildlife we observe. At day's end, return to camp for dinner under the stars, followed by time for sharing stories around the fire.

MAUN / NORTHERN OKAVANGO DELTA

Day 3: Fly into the waterways of the Okavango Delta

- Travel by light aircraft to Nat Hab's secluded Explorer Camp—Okavango North
- Enter a UNESCO-listed landscape of lagoons, channels and palm-fringed islands
- Look for lions, leopards, elephants, hippos and other wildlife from a private bush camp

After a leisurely breakfast, we drive back to the airport in Maun, then fly by light aircraft to our private safari camp in the northern Okavango Delta. The delta has grown over millennia as millions of tons of sand were carried down the Okavango River from its source in Angola. The shimmering emerald landscape creates a verdant contrast with the surrounding desert as the river fans out over the Kalahari sands to create the world's largest inland delta—5,800 square miles of swampy marsh, clear channels, lagoons and islands. A planetary marvel, its meandering waterways are filled with hippo, crocodile, red lechwe, wattled cranes and more. In 2014, the Okavango Delta became the 1,000th destination to be officially inscribed on the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites. From our secluded bush camp base in the heart of this vast wilderness, we're in prime position to encounter lion, leopard, cheetah, elephant, hippo and much more.



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NORTHERN OKAVANGO DELTA

Days 4 & 5: Search for wild dogs and big cats across the northern Okavango

- Explore winding channels by boat when water levels permit
- Search for endangered African wild dogs near one of the delta's top denning areas
- Track lions, leopards and elephants with expert local guides

Embrace the natural rhythms of the delta's varied habitats as we explore via 4x4 wildlife drives and, when water levels permit, excursions by boat and mokoro, the traditional poled canoe of the delta. Within this unspoiled watery expanse in the heart of Southern Africa's interior, surprise encounters with nature await at every turn. Wake to the call of an African fish eagle before setting off into a labyrinth of lush waterways fringed with palms and papyrus. Our guides have a deep, long-cultivated intimacy with this environment, and their ability to track and spot wildlife is second to none.

We set out to explore from our remote camp, which rests under a stand of large leadwood trees, surrounded by tawny grasslands interwoven with shimmering channels and lagoons, mopane woodlands and ilala palm islands. It's ideal for terrain for the Okavango's famous elephants, which are thrilling to see on land or in the water. The rich mosaic of habitats provides ample food for a large array of browsers and grazers, including African buffalo and the regal sable antelope. And where the prey go, predators follow: This corner of the Okavango has some of the highest concentrations of lions in the delta. It is also well known for a thriving population of endangered African wild dog, with a top denning area close to camp. We may also spot leopard, cheetah and hyena among the predators on patrol. Birdlife in the region is equally remarkable, with more than 350 recorded species, including the endangered wattled crane, Hottentot teal, carmine bee-eater and Pel's fishing-owl.

Explore the diverse range of habitats on all-day excursions including traditional 4x4 game drives, picnic lunches in the bush, and night drives in search of nocturnal species. After the Milky Way emerges in the night sky, return to camp for dinner, and fall asleep to the sounds of the bush, with nothing but a layer of canvas between you and the African wild.



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NORTHERN OKAVANGO / KHWAI PRIVATE RESERVE

Day 6: Enter a community-owned reserve along the Khwai River

- Fly to the private Khwai Concession bordering Moremi Game Reserve
- Watch elephants gather along the life-giving Khwai River
- Look for lions, leopards, sable antelope and African wild dogs

After a final morning at our secluded camp, fly to the private Khwai Concession. This massive wildlife sanctuary bordering the famous Moremi Game Reserve is a community-owned concession encompassing riverine woodlands, floodplains, mopane forest and open grasslands. The Khwai River is a lifeline for the region, and elephants abound. We're likely to see waterbuck, reedbuck and many antelope species, including the water-adapted red lechwe, along with lion, leopard and spotted hyena. Khwai's varied habitats also support the majestic sable antelope and packs of African wild dog. In addition, more than 450 bird species have been recorded in the area.

KHWAI PRIVATE RESERVE

Days 7 & 8: Explore Khwai's wildlife-rich habitats at an unhurried pace

- Discover the reserve on wildlife drives, walking safaris and mokoro excursions when water levels permit
- Watch for elephants, buffalo, antelope and prolific birdlife across floodplains and forests
- Learn how community-led tourism protects wildlife corridors and supports local livelihoods

Private game reserves managed by local communities protect threatened species and keep wildlife corridors intact, opening our passage into an unbroken sanctuary of marshes, sand-covered plains, and acacia and mopane forest. Explore Khwai's vast territory on morning and afternoon wildlife drives, walking safaris and poled mokoro (when water levels permit). This serene time on the water gives local polers a chance to share their deep knowledge of this ecosystem and how it has sustained their people for generations. Wildlife abounds, including elephant, buffalo, herds of plains game and countless bird species. Khwai's community-based concession has been a conservation triumph, bridging safari tourism with Khwai village life and enhancing economic stability for the local people.



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KHWAI PRIVATE RESERVE / MAUN

Day 9: Search for wildlife one last time before leaving Botswana

- Take a final wildlife drive or watch for animals around camp
- Fly by light aircraft to Maun for onward connections

Depending on the precise timing of our flight departure this morning, we will make a final quest for wildlife on the Khwai Reserve, or we'll look for animals around our tranquil camp. By late morning, we fly back to Maun by light aircraft to connect with onward flights.

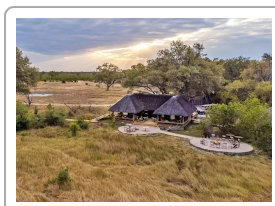

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Mandatory Insurance

Since the areas we travel to are remote and wild (that's why we go there!), we require that all guests have, at minimum, medical evacuation insurance for this program. This is for the safety of all guests. We require that your chosen independent insurance plan includes at least \$250,000 in medical evacuation coverage.

To protect your investment and to provide peace of mind while you travel, we also strongly recommend purchasing comprehensive travel insurance. Plans may cover everything from medical treatment to trip cancellations and delays and lost luggage. This trip begins and ends in Maun, Botswana. Because this is a long international journey, **we recommend that you arrive at least one night prior to Day 1** to rest from your travels and begin the trip refreshed. You must arrive in Maun by 1:45 pm on Day 1 in order to join the group for the first scheduled activities.

You may depart Maun anytime after 1:30 pm on the final day.
