PORTO

Day 1: Taste Port in Vila Nova de Gaia before dinner above the Douro

- Tour the cellars of Cockburn's Port Lodge during a private tasting
- Join your Expedition Leader for a welcome dinner overlooking Porto's medieval skyline

Our adventure begins in Porto, Portugal's second-largest city and cultural capital of the beguiling North. Scenic Porto sits amid granite cliffs at the mouth of the Douro River and has long been a cosmopolitan trading center. The compact city is rich in architectural heritage from Roman, Gothic, Baroque, Neoclassic and Renaissance eras. This afternoon, we'll meet for an orientation of the week ahead followed by a trip across the river to Vila Nova de Gaia where we enjoy a private cellar tour and tasting at Cockburn's Port Lodge —the perfect start to a wine-soaked week ahead! We then head over to W. & J. Graham's 1890 Lodge for a welcome dinner at its acclaimed restaurant, Vinum, with its glass atrium and open-air terrace perched high on the southern bank of the Douro overlooking Porto's medieval landmarks. Featuring the best local ingredients of the Tras-os-Montes region, Northern Portugal and the Atlantic Ocean, dishes are created for pairing with fine Douro Valley wines.



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Itinerary At A Glance

Day 8
Porto / Depart

POCINHO / FELGAR

Day 2: Ride the Douro railway through Europe's oldest wine country

- Follow the river 100 miles upriver on the historic Linha do Douro
- Dine with hosts Ana and Jorge at their restored village farmstead
- Walk through almond and cork orchards to a viewpoint above the Sabor River

Today we journey by rail 100 miles up the Douro Valley, one of Europe's oldest winemaking areas. UNESCO has recognized the Alto Douro Wine Region as a World Heritage Site, with wine produced here for more than 2,000 years. The Douro Valley, the only place authentic Port wine is made, is the world's first demarcated wine region, established in 1756. This long tradition of viticulture has produced a cultural landscape of outstanding beauty, shaping the social and economic heritage of the region. Paralleling the riverbank on a small local train on the Linha do Douro line, we reach Pocinho, where we disembark and continue to the sleepy village of Felgar and Casa de Santa Cruz, where lunch awaits. This historic farmstead on the main square has been beautifully restored by the owners, Ana and Jorge, who share a passion for this place that feels lost in time. This afternoon, join our Expedition Leader for a walk beyond the village to a viewpoint over the Sabor River, wandering among almond and cork orchards and learning about life in this bucolic region as we go. Then return to our peaceful inn where a gourmet dinner awaits.

DOURO INTERNATIONAL NATURAL PARK

Day 3: Explore Portugal's wild border with Spain by 4x4 and on foot

- Travel through Douro International Natural Park along the river frontier
- Watch for Griffon vultures, red kites and eagles above the rocky gorge
- Hike through cork oak and chestnut forest to a river viewpoint

Far up the Douro River in a remote sector of the valley we find a protected nature sanctuary, which we explore on an all-day 4x4 outing today. This 335 square miles of rugged terrain comprises Douro International Natural Park, with Portugal on one bank and Spain on the other. It was created to protect the scenery and wildlife of the region, including eagles, red kites, Griffon vultures, herons, wild boar, and one of the last packs of wolves in the Tras-os-Montes region, which lives inland from the river. Natural vegetation covers the banks along this stretch of the Douro, with juniper, cork oak, holm oak and chestnut trees providing a green veneer for the rocky landscape. We gain a more intimate view on foot, hiking a loop trail through our wild environs. At midday we stop for a picnic lunch, surrounded by nature, before continuing to a striking viewpoint. When we return to Casa de Santa Cruz, there's time for a swim before another incredible dinner.



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CALCADA DE ALPAJARES / CASA DO RIO

Day 4: Cruise the Douro to a secluded inn among the vineyards

- Hike an ancient Roman road past the 8,000-year-old rock art of Fraga do Gato
- Join a guided olive oil tasting at the mill where local olives are pressed
- Sail by private boat to Casa do Rio and taste Quinta do Vallado wines among the vines

Start the morning with a walk on the little-discovered Calcada de Alpajares trail. The cobbled route through rugged mountains is a section of an ancient 5,000-mile-long Roman road, winding across a spectacular landscape. Our path takes us through a fascinating realm of schist arches and quartzite outcrops, past dramatic panoramas and precipitous drops into steep-walled valleys. It reveals traces of an ancient human presence, evidenced in the cave paintings of Fraga do Gato, which are over 8,000 years old, and the ancient settlement of Castro de São Paulo, dating back to the Bronze Age and with traces of Roman occupation.

Stop in Barca d'Alva for a picnic lunch, followed by an olive oil tasting. On a visit to the lagar where the olives are pressed, we learn about the entire process, from harvesting to the final product. Then, it's time to board a private boat for a cruise downriver to stunning Casa do Rio, our luxury base for the next three nights. This intimate guesthouse is surrounded by the vineyards of Quinta do Vallado, one of the premier producers of table wines in the Douro Valley. Set into a steep hillside with panoramic views over the river below, the contemporary inn enjoys complete solitude. Relax on the terrace or refresh with a dip in the infinity pool following a guided afternoon stroll through the vineyards, with a chance to taste some of the estate's renowned vintages. And if the fine accommodations and glorious setting aren't enough, wait till you taste the gourmet dinner that comes out of the Casa's tiny kitchen!



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DOURO RIVER / QUINTA DAS MOS / PRAZO ROMAN RUINS

Day 5: Kayak the upper Douro through a narrow granite gorge

- Watch for Egyptian vultures, Griffon vultures and golden eagles overhead
- Join the Cabral family for a homemade lunch at their boutique winery
- Explore the remains of a Roman villa built above a prehistoric settlement at Prazo

We greet the morning with anticipation: It's time to meet the river at eye level! We first drive to Foz do Sabor, where we get fitted to our kayaks and become comfortable with maneuvering them, with plenty of helpful pointers from our Expedition Leader. Launching from a sandy beach, we find our paddling rhythm, gliding downstream through a scenic stretch of river with steep, rocky banks rising on either side. The river narrows considerably, and it feels a bit like we're paddling through a rock garden as we guide our kayaks between the granite walls. Be sure to look up periodically, as this area is frequented by an array of raptors—we could see the Egyptian vulture and the Griffon vulture, Europe's largest vulture species. Other birds of prey overhead might include the golden eagle, Bonelli's eagle, peregrine falcon and Eurasian eagle-owl. Once we're through the gorge, the river widens again as we paddle past a tranquil tableau of vineyards interwoven in a tapestry of chestnut forests, olive orchards and grazing sheep.

After a few hours, we reach our takeout point at Freixo de Numao, then make a winding drive into the hills high above the Douro where a special lunch and winery tour are in store at Quinta das Mos, a boutique winery producing outstanding white and red table wines and olive oil. Our hosts, the Cabral family, provide a huge homemade repast along with a warm and gracious welcome. Before we leave, there's a chance to purchase bottles of both wine and olive oil to take home—you won't find it anywhere else!

Late this afternoon, meet a local guide for a walking tour of the small town of Freixo do Numão, followed by a visit to the Prazo Roman ruins. In 1986, as a hilly slope was being cleared to plant almond trees, schist graves and fragments of Roman columns were uncovered, and an archaeological dig revealed well-preserved remains of a 2nd century Roman villa built atop a prehistoric settlement. At this little-visited site, view remnants of several structures including a Paleo-Christian basilica, manor house, elaborate bathing area, old castle and numerous tombs, before returning to Casa do Rio.



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COA VALLEY

Day 6: See Paleolithic rock art preserved from a dam's rising waters

- View horses, bovines and other figures carved into the rock more than 20,000 years ago
- Tour the Coa Museum with an archaeology expert
- Dine beneath the stars on the terrace at Casa do Rio

Today offers an encounter with the layered history and culture of the Coa Valley, which contains one of the world's most important ancient rock art sites. Depart by van to visit the Coa Valley Archaeological Park, where we learn from archaeology experts about the extensive Paleolithic drawings near Vila Nova de Foz Coa, discovered in the late 1980s and designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1998. The park contains some 5,000 engraved drawings of horses, bovines and other animals, and human and abstract figures, dated from 22,000 to 10,000 B.C. and documenting continuous human occupation from the end of the Paleolithic Age. The entire region was slated to be inundated by a dam under construction at the time of discovery, but after intense public pressure, the project was halted to preserve the extraordinary discovery. We'll see one of the rock art sites up close, a tiny sampler of the most remarkable open-air ensemble of Paleolithic art on the Iberian Peninsula. After, we'll head to the Coa Museum for a guided tour and lunch at the stylish museum café. Those who wish can walk back to our accommodation along the river, otherwise, a transfer is provided. Back at Casa do Rio this evening, another starlit dinner on the terrace awaits.

VALEIRA GORGE / PORTO

Day 7: Paddle through Valeira Gorge beneath the Douro's terraced vineyards

- Cruise past historic wine estates, including Quinta do Vesuvio and Quinta de Vargellas
- Kayak between steep schist slopes covered in grapevines
- Return to Porto for a farewell dinner with Port and regional wines

Transfer by van this morning to the river, where we board a private motorboat for a relaxing cruise down the Douro to our paddling put-in at Ferradosa. Along the way, we pass some of the Douro Valley's most magnificent quintas—the traditional wine estates of the region— including Graham's Quinta do Vesuvio, built in 1565, and Taylor's Quinta de Vargellas, established in 1820. Launching our kayaks from a small beach, we embark on a peaceful paddle between steeply terraced schist mountains covered in grapevines. We're bound for Valeira Gorge, a narrow, rugged canyon carved over millennia, where we often see raptors soaring overhead, including Egyptian vultures. Once we arrive at our take-out point of Foz do Tua, we step ashore for a picnic lunch on the riverbank, then head back to Porto by van to complete our journey. A festive farewell dinner awaits, with Port and other fine Portuguese wine flowing freely on our last evening together.



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PORTO

Day 8: Depart Porto after a week along the Douro

- Transfer to the airport for homeward flights

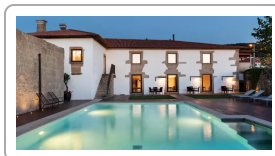

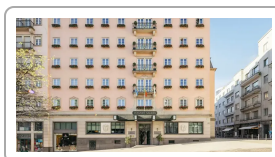
Casa de Santa Cruz

A Rare Opportunity to Experience the Douro River at Eye Level

You're not likely to see other paddlers on the Douro, since boat traffic in this little-visited region consists mostly of small local craft and the occasional sightseeing vessel. Periodically, we pass a larger river cruise ship farther upstream. Our quiet, water-level perspective on the shoreline, birdlife, olive groves and grape terraces offers a peaceful encounter you won't get elsewhere.

3

Travel with Just 12 Guests

Our small group offers an intimate opportunity to explore more remote locales and stay in small, traditional settings that bus-based tour groups and river cruise ship passengers don't have access to. Far from the bustle of Porto and the lower Douro, which most visitors limit their travel to, we have a tranquil experience on and off the river, essential to rewarding nature travel.

4

Visit Three UNESCO World Heritage Sites

Our itinerary includes three very different World Heritage Sites of global distinction. We begin in the Historic Center of Porto, built along the hills above the mouth of the Douro River with a rich 2,000-year history marked by various conquests and numerous monuments. The majority of our time is spent in the second World Heritage Site, the Alto Douro Wine Region, which is the world's oldest demarcated wine region. And the third is the Prehistoric Rock Art Sites of the Coa Valley—see #5 below.



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5

Guided Tour of the Coa Valley Museum & Archaeological Park

Learn from archaeology experts about the extensive Paleolithic drawings discovered in the Coa Valley in the late 1980s, which were designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1998. Start with a guided tour of the museum, then travel by van and on foot into the Archaeological Park containing thousands of engraved drawings of horses, bovines and other animals, and human and abstract figures, dated from 22,000 to 10,000 B.C. With our local guide, we examine rock art sites in detail, evidence of continuous human habitation in the valley for millennia.

Stay in Luxury Inns on the Vineyard Estates of the Douro Valley

The historic *quintas*—wine estates—of the Douro Valley are a highlight of our trip. Many are centuries old and still run by the farming families who have grown grapes and made wine in this region for generations. Some produce other local products as well, such as olive oil, nuts and preserves. Staying on a quinta is an experience well off the typical tourist track!

Indulge in Fabulous Food and Wine

On this trip, food and wine will be among your most memorable experiences! Our hosts at each quinta (the wine estates where we stay) take great pride in filling us with hearty repasts of homemade local fare and endlessly flowing local wines—in addition to its famous Port, the Douro Valley produces noteworthy table wines, too. From fresh oranges, almonds, honey and olive oil to farm-raised lamb and pork and artisan cheeses, much of what we enjoy is raised right on or near the estates where we stay. If you're a traveler who's decidedly a gourmand, this trip will delight your palate! (And...*all* the wine is included! No extra charges to worry about.)

Important Information About This Trip

This unique trip (and we don't use the term "unique" lightly) is so much more than a hiking and paddling adventure. It's a thorough immersion in a slice of rural Portuguese life that very few travelers are fortunate to experience. Through our longstanding local connections in the Douro Valley, we have been able to craft a one-of-a-kind itinerary that gets into natural and cultural settings totally off the typical tourist trail. By focusing on the upper section of the Douro River, we're away from busier areas, offering an encounter with regional traditions and lifestyles you'd be unlikely to discover on your own or on a more standard tour. We stay in small family-run inns, often part of a wine estate, enjoying fabulous home-cooked fare and free-flowing wine, both red and white table wines and the famous ports of the world's first demarcated wine region. You'll get to know your hosts, enjoying convivial conversation and insights into local life you won't find elsewhere.

Please note, only four single kayaks are available per departure and need to be reserved in advance (at no additional charge). They will be confirmed on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are interested, please let our Adventure Concierge team know as soon as possible. Please be aware, however, that final assignments will be made at the discretion of our Expedition Leader and based on the best interest and safety of the group.



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Mandatory Insurance

Since the areas we travel to are remote and wild (that's why we go there!), we require that all guests have, at minimum, medical evacuation insurance for this program. This is for the safety of all guests. We require that your chosen independent insurance plan includes at least \$250,000 in medical evacuation coverage.

To protect your investment and to provide peace of mind while you travel, we also strongly recommend purchasing comprehensive travel insurance. Plans may cover everything from medical treatment to trip cancellations and delays and lost luggage.
